Dr Miles Ellis -The real Burma, an Englishman's View



We were treated to a very interesting illustrated talk at our last regular meeting by Dr Miles Ellis. He had been inspired by his great-aunt, Beth Ellis, who had been permitted to read at Oxford University, but forbidden to study for a degree as part of the syllabus was philosophy, a subject considered too dangerous for the female mind. Beth had toured many parts, including Burma and her first of many books was entitled, An English Girls Impression of Burmah (sic). Beth had such success with

this that she wrote many more books in her relatively short life, but she unfortunately died prematurely, in childbirth. Dr Ellis gave many interesting facts including one pagoda roofed with 60 tons of 24 carat gold. An interesting and entertaining ramble in a country so very different from Britain.


