






John, Paul, George and me by Andy Smith

Another brilliantly sunny morning for our monthly meeting on Friday 16th February 2018 brought forth 130 members to share a morning of pure nostalgia, centred on the works of Lennon, McCartney and Harrison, all expertly presented for us by Andy Smith of Rugby.







He demonstrated his proficiency on a variety of guitar styled instruments including the modest ukulele sometimes favoured by George Harrison and the mandolin. Andy's interest had begun early in life as a child of six and his first guitar was in fact a 'Beatles' guitar from Woolworths costing 15 shillings (75p). A modest beginning indeed, but he was soon 'hooked' on the highly original works of the more artistic elements of the Beatles.

We were encouraged to sing along with the numbers that were so familiar to those of us of a certain age, but we were also given an insight into some of the interaction and friendly rivalry that took place between John, Paul &

George, as they sought to write better and more popular songs, as well as the collaborations in producing the familiar Beatles music.

There was a section of the presentation on 'Guess the intro', in which he would play the first few bars of the instrumental introduction to a Beatles number and ask the audience to name the tunes. Thrapston U3A appear to know their pop music very well and got each one right.

Andy interspersed his playing with anecdotes from his experiences and family life, where he has imposed his love of the Beatles onto his children (some of whom are also musicians) to carry the music forward. Many hearts were touched with a story of his daughter's wedding which was to be held outside in the open air. The day had dawned very wet but improved slowly. Andy and his son were to play at the ceremony and as they began the tune 'Here comes the sun', almost as if by magic, the clouds parted and the sun shone through. In the Plaza, a chorus of "aahs" filled the room on hearing this story.

Andy has been using his talents to raise funds for two favoured charities from the sale of his CDs and with generous donations from his audiences. He is very proud that he has so far donated in excess of £6,000,

shared between MacMillan Nurses and Cystic Fibrosis Research, as both of these causes having affected his family.

Andy Smith's talents are not restricted to the Beatles, as he has been writing a musical entitled 'Snowfall in July' and has obtained Crowdfunding to enable him to develop the show and to take it on tour. He has aspirations to bring it to Thrapston Plaza in the future and it will be something not to be missed.

French Encore formed in Autumn 2017






Boys' Toys

"To book a place on any activity or event, the full amount must be paid by the date set. All monies paid are non-refundable unless the activity or event is cancelled by the organiser."



Bure Valley steam railway and Norfolk Broads


