Who gets to play the Prince?. Why YOU and each and every member of our U3A by returning to group activities, by coming to the 'real' Plaza meetings starting in September.


As a starter to face to face meetings, the U3A Day stall at the June Farmers Market was a beginning, as will be the Summer Social. This year we are trying something a touch different.

Review of the 18th June 2021 Zoom Presentation "Life in the Music by Andy Smith

This was the third visit made to our group by Andy Smith and his presentation was as fresh as ever. With his prepared video presentation he took us on a journey through his musical career including very personal insights into his private and family life which could easily have led to the title of the presentation being renamed Love in the Music.

Andy got his first guitar at the age of 11 and began writing songs about a year later, recording them in MP3 format. Some years later he took his first U3A engagement with Bedworth group but it posed two questions for him. One he didn't know what U3A was and two he didn't know what to do or say. He is a quick learner and decided that he would theme his talk with a catalogue his life in his songs. Using this format also formed the core of his presentation to Thrapston U3A.

Andy was born and grew up in Lincoln. His parents said he was an unhappy baby always yelling during his waking hours and said his son was just the same which led him to write a song called the 'Baby Blues', which he performed for us. Written in a humorous vein describing the trials and tribulations of managing infants from birth onwards. He eagerly anticipated visits to Lincoln by traveling funfairs and circuses and his next song, with his mandolin accompaniment was called 'Big Top' reflected his enthusiasm for the circus.

Among his collection of stringed instruments is an unusual 4 stringed Tenor Guitar, popular with folk music artists and an American 'Ovation' Andy has acquired an array of instruments including a Ukulele all of which he handles with great care and affection.

His presentation was spiced with anecdotes including references to the first band he formed with two girl singers (one only 14 years old) and two other musicians with the band management being handled by Andy's Mum who he was pleased to tell was still with us, now aged 96 years old. Her favourite song being the Gordon Lightfoot number 'Leaving on a Jet Plane'.

We heard of Andy's early encounters with alcohol as a young musician playing the pubs and revealing the humorous times and pitfalls of the experience in a song about getting drunk and 'Going for an Indian Meal'.

Andy was married to Helen, a graphic artist and illustrator of children's books who originated from Manchester, she was clearly the love of his life for 33 years and they have a son and daughter now in their early thirties but so sadly Helen passed away and the pain was very evident when Andy sang the Don MacLean number 'Vincent' which had been her favourite song.

Now resident in Rugby where he has been for many years Andy cut his teeth on the folk scene often performing at The Dun Cow, Daventry in a small theatre at the rear of the pub on Sunday evenings as a 'floor singer'. Basically the warm up act for bigger names which were the main event. This later inspired him to write a folk song 'Girl with the Innocent Smile'.

Eventually after several mostly unsatisfactory years of working for Nat West bank Andy set up his own business giving Guitar lessons and this gave him the idea to write a song about tutoring two young hopefuls that contained two verses one of which we were assured was true and the other not true and we were left to decide for ourselves which was which. The final song of this excellent presentation was called 'Lullaby' dedicated to his children with a verse for each.

Andy's presentation and video was produced in his home studio, formerly used by Helen for her artistic works. It was a fascinating musical biography and a great pleasure for all. I am sure we will meet again.

Out to

TREACLE SPONGE

Serves 6-8

3 tbsp golden syrup, plus 3-4 tbsp extra to serve

- 175gself-raising flour
- 1 rounded tsp baking powder
- 175g very soft butter
- 3 large eggs
- 175g soft light brown sugar
- 1 tbsp black treacle



- Butter a 1-2 litre pudding basin well. Cut a double thickness of kitchen foil approximately 30 x
 40 cms
- Grease a tablespoon and measure the 3 tbsp golden syrup into the pudding basin.
- Sift the flour and baking powder into large mixing bowl and add the soft butter, eggs, sugar and black treacle. Using an electric hand whisk (or large fork and a lot of elbow grease) beat the mixture for about 2 minutes or until thoroughly blended..
- Spoon the mixture into the basin and use the back of a spoon to level the top.
- Cover the basin with the foil, making a pleat in the centre. Pull the foil down the outside of the basin and tie in place around the rim with string, taking the string over the top and tying it on the other side making a handle .Trim of the excess foil all the way round.
- Place the pudding in a steamer fitted over a saucepan of boiling water and steam the pudding for 2 hours, checking the water level halfway though.
- To serve, loosen the pudding all around using a palette knife, invert it onto a warmed plate and pour the extra syrup over the top before taking it to the table..
- Serve with custard or ice cream.

CHESS CAN BE ENJOYABLE (& GOOD FOR YOU)














There is little doubt that playing a game of chess improves concentration, memory, decision making and spatial comprehension.
